

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Way of the Wise

Gospel: Mark 9:30-37

"Whoever welcomes a child such as this for my sake

welcomes me."

We can imagine the conversation the disciples must have been having about who is most important. Peter is saying, "I'm the first to act! I'm right at this side every time!" John points out that it is he who reclines his head on Jesus' chest at supper. Andrew says, "I was one of the first to follow. Peter wouldn't even be here if not for me." Judas says, "He trusts me with the purse." But Matthew keeps the books, and is taking good notes for what might be a prophetic parchment one day. They all have their reasons to think they are most vital to the mission.

Jesus puts an end to this nonsense by saying the most important one is the one who seeks to be least important. Then he draws out a child by way of example. What an irrelevant person a child was seen to be! A child was an economic liability, a helpless person in need of defense. But Jesus says: Value this person as you would me.

The sight of that child's uplifted face made all their arguments fall away.

Questions for Reflection

- * Where do you see signs of justice in your community? Where are the signs of injustice?
- * How has desire made you unwise? How does wisdom calm the desire for more?
- * Who do we consider valuable according to the standards of society? Around whom would Jesus wrap his arms and stand in our midst?

Action Response

Where in your life are you a leader? In your family, at school, at work, among friends? Practice being the servant of all. Enter your group as one available to welcome the humblest person as you would Christ.





Baptismal Preparation

Anointing of the Sick

Anointing of the Sick is the sacrament that is received by those who are ill or suffering. By the sacred anointing and the prayer of the priest, the whole Church commends those who are sick to Christ. The sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gifts of strength, faith, peace and courage, and his or her suffering is united with the suffering of Christ for the building up of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos. 1520-23).

Parishioners should call the parish office to request hospital visits and to schedule individual anointing during a serious illness or in advance of a surgery.

The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God.




