

YOUR FAITH, THIS WEEK

TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Whose Side Are You On?

Gospel: Mark 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

"Anyone who is not against us is with us."

John brings to Jesus the same saga Joshua brought to Moses: Someone not of our company is speaking in the name of the Lords, with the same success. Jesus points out, I imagine dryly, that anyone expelling demons in his name is likely on his side. It is an argument he used with those who questioned his own power over demons: Might he be in league with Beelzebul? Jesus countered: Beelzebul is having a bad day if he is casting out his own demons! Good fruit comes from good hearts, and rotten fruit from rotten hearts. It is a simple enough formula to understand.

Jesus moves much further than we would like in this argument. He says whatever leads us into sin is not worth possessing. The extreme examples he uses are gory but sincere. If we cannot stop our eyes from causing us to sin, we have less need of the eye than of ridding ourselves of the sin. Few self-mutilations occur in parishes after the Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, so one must presume we have found other ways of avoiding the sins that most attract us.

Ouestions for Reflection

- * When have you heard the right prophecy from the "wrong" source? How did it affect your ability to receive the message?
- * How good do you want to be? How might you measure how good you already are?
- * Think of a time when you may have become involved in serious sin. How did you "cut it off" from your life?

Action Response

Think about your answer to the second reflection question: How good do you want to be? What keeps you from answering that call? Resolve to "cut off" one aspect of your behavior that keeps you from being as good as you are called to be.





Protecting God's Children

In 2005, the Diocese of Charleston began implementing a plan to protect our children from child sexual abuse. The plan includes child protection awareness sessions for adults (Virtus), screening process for all adults working with children and vulnerable adults and a child safety awareness program ("Protecting God's Children").

We will be offering Protecting God's Children to all children and youth in grades K5-12 on Wednesday, October 3rd during their Religious Education sessions. An OPT OUT form was placed on the reverse side of the Registration Form for parents who do not wish their child to participate in this program. Diocesan policy states that parishes must have a signed Opt Out form for every child in our Religious Education and Youth Ministry programs who is not attending the program. If you did not sign the OPT OUT form then you have given permission for your child to attend the session on October 3rd. Copies of the program overview were sent home on September 26th. Baptismal Preparation

- Both parents are asked to be present at the Baptism. However, if for some valid reason one parent cannot attend the class, the Catholic parent must attend.
- As part of the Baptismal Rite, parents are promising to raise their child in the faith. So that the Church may have an expectation that the child will be raised in the Faith, parents must be registered, participating members of St. Peter's for at least 6 months.

The sick person receives the Holy Spirit's gifts of strength, faith, peace and courage, and his or her suffering is united with the suffering of Christ for the building up of the Church (Catechism of the Catholic Church, nos.

The visible reality we see in the Sacraments is their outward expression, the form they take, and the way in which they are administered and received. The invisible reality we cannot "see" is God's grace, his gracious initiative in redeeming us through the death and Resurrection of his Son. 


